Dear Readers,

As the seasons of the year change we find ourselves doing new things - putting away the winter jumpers for another year and getting out the t-shirts and shorts and gardening tools ready to get stuff growing - or trying in vain to stop it, in the case of my lawn!

The church too changes seasons, and we are moving out of Easter-tide and into a long season of what is known as 'Ordinary Time' - not because it is any way ordinary, but because this is the time of the year when we revert to our normal *order* of things, without the festive flair of the other seasons. We will settle into a gentle rhythm through this summer time... But just because it's no longer Festival time doesn't mean there's not loads to celebrate.

The first thing is that, subject to agreement by the PCC when it meets this weekend, we will have some small changes to our pattern of services at St. Mary Willesborough from July. From a glorious Holy Week and Easter we moved straight into a whole variety of things as diverse as Herbie's defib training and the tea for the Coronation of the King; the film show and the quiz night. There's been loads happening in our churches for us as a church family and for our local community, and it's always great to see so many people popping in to the cafe too. If you've not had one of our bacon baguettes yet, then you are missing out!

And on that note, I want us to celebrate those who just carry on carrying on in the background making so many things in our churches just tick along nicely. There are too many of you to name individually, but I want us all to be thankful and grateful for the gifts of our cafe volunteers, our local leadership team and ministry team, our flower ladies, our bellringers, our choir, our musicians, our churchwardens, our historians, our volunteers with children, our setter-uppers and our take-downers, our worship facilitators, our intercessors and readers, our cleaners, our home group leaders, as well as those who hold roles

Snippets from Sevington Church (compiled by Spencer Stone)

The following has been taken from the 'Guide to St. Mary's Church, Sevington'; a hard copy of which can be found, along with listings and an A2 plan of the churchyard inside Sevington Church, to the left of the entrance.

Mysteries of Sevington Church, Part Two: The Missing Brasses

There are a number of memorials (7) around the church floor, in the chancel, nave and south aisle which have scarring from where brasses have been removed (presumed to have been forcibly removed during Cromwell's time).

An account of these brasses was given in 1628 by Sir Edward Dering, which even included some of his own illustrations of four of them (belonging to the Barre(y) family):

From 'A Saunter Through Kent – Vol. 13', Sir Charles Igglesden, 1919 (p66-74):

"Sir Edward Dering, a learned antiquary of the seventeenth century, has placed on record a description of four of these brasses. Their disappearance therefore must have occurred after that date. Sir Edward gives sketches of four of them, two of which I reproduce. The male figure is one of the Barreys, probably Sir John Barrey, who about 1347 paid towards the expenses of conferring the honour of knighthood upon the Black Prince. It will be noticed that the sword is missing, but the dotted lines show where it should be. The female figure represents Margaret Barrey, who died in 1400, but the costume she is wearing is usually associated with ninety years afterwards. The explanation may be that the brass was placed in the church some years after her death. She was the wife of Edward Barrey and a member of the Sussex family of Oxenbridge. It appears that Sir Edward Dering visited Sevington Church on the 9th of May, 1628, and took copies of these brasses. He subsequently published a book entitled "Church Notes" and reproduced these sketches amongst many others in the country, including Ashford and Willesborough."

There is another train of thought that the brasses may still be present on-site, but hidden, although there is only one reference to this:

From 'The Daily Mirror, Monday, 13th July 1936:

"The ancient vaults have not been opened for years. Is it suspected that they may contain valuable brasses. If we found the brasses, they might defray our expenses, but opening the vaults would be a costly operation"."
